

CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

For many we offer a first experience of theatre. These experiences offer young people and families ways to explore the world, new ideas around play, interaction and development and most importantly a sense of ambition, escapism, fun and links into their communities.

In a town with no theatre, poor transport links and high levels of deprivation we strive to ensure every primary age child can enjoy the magic of theatre. We work strategically in partnership with schools to increase access to creative provision and to embed creative teaching.

24% of Mendip's population are children - the highest of all Somerset's districts.

In the communities we work with, 15.6 % of people in Shepton Mallet live in very high areas of deprivation (compared to 3.9% Somerset Average), 13.2% live in above average deprivation.

We work in care homes and in the community to bring joy, connection and new experiences that get people talking and sharing memories and experiences. Seeing something new, laughing with your neighbour, feeling hopeful and experimenting are some of the outcomes we love best

We work in every primary school in Shepton Mallet. We work in the surrounding villages and schools. We also work in communities in Frome.

We are passionate about working with people who traditionally get less of a say in how society is run.

We don't have an office - we work remotely and in this last year took performances to 21 different spaces indoor and outdoors.





### OUR STRATEGIC PLAN WITH PARTNER SCHOOLS

#### Young people's ambitions for Shepton Mallet

We ran a two hour creative session with young people aged 6-13 to explore their feelings about creativity and why its important and to find out where they think the focus of our work should be going forward. Their core vision identified that

- We want Shepton Mallet to be the most creative place to grow up in the UK
- · We want Shepton Mallet to be a place where creativity makes everyone friends



#### **Key Findings**

For young people involved we found the main reasons they feel creativity and performing arts was so important was in helping them to:

- Make friends and new social connections
- Develop their confidence and self esteem
- And as a way of having fun

100% of children felt they needed more creative opportunities in schools 100% of children surveyed said that performing helps them grow in confidence 79% said that they felt it was important for young people to make decisions about their town
